Ap	proaches to Address Academic Gap Filling	
Spring 2021	Currently, to close gaps, Campbell City Schools is open five days a week to our traditional students. Remote students are worked with daily. We have interventions for traditional students as well as remote students. A math intervention program will be developed for next year for students who are in need of math intervention based upon the data collected this spring and summer. In partnership with MCESC, a career counselor has worked with high school seniors and graduation requirements. Summer 2021	A three-week summer school session will be provided this summer. Programming will be 4 hours a day, five days a week. Breakfast and lunch will be provided. The session will run June 14-July 2nd. Transportation will be needed and provided for summer programming. Impact Academy will use Mastery Grading to determine what students are eligible and determine the summer session's growth. Ten to 15 students per grade level will be targeted. The session will run June 14-July 2nd. Four teachers will be needed. Campbell Elementary and Middle School will have a three-week summer intervention session for K-3 students and a three-week session for 4-6. Each grade level will target 10-12 students per grade. This program will begin June 14th until July 2nd. Success By Six, a program through a partnership with the United Way, will have two sites that 25-30 rising kindergarteners will participate in. This is a four week program. This will run from Monday- Thursday starting July 19th through August 12th. Campbell Memorial High School will host a three-week summer program. Seventh and eighth graders will attend. Ninth through twelfth graders will use Grad Point for credit recovery this summer. A Homework Monitor for students grades K-6 will provide 18 hours a week of free tutoring through August 31st in partnership with the Public Library of Youngstown and Mahoning County. 2021 - 2022	Campbell City Schools will use Response to Intervention (RTI) to provide literacy interventions such as LLI and Heggerty. New literacy interventions called Rewards and Phonics for Reading will be implemented. A decision flow chart will be utilized to determine the best intervention for students based on assessment results. Campbell City Schools will continue to offer after-school programming for students in grades K-6 and 7-12. A new math intervention program will be added for grades k-6. Campbell City Schools will investigate a blending learning platform. Graduation Pathways will be implemented at Campbell Memorial High School. Career counselor services will also be utilized.
