The information provided is to educate students and parents about precautions and changes that will occur over the course of a student’s day so they may receive an education in a functioning environment.

Things to know...

Daily System and Assessment: Parents or guardians must conduct an assessment of a student’s health before the student leaves for school each day by checking for common symptoms of COVID-19. Students should stay home if symptoms are identified such as:

- Temperature 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit or higher when taken by mouth
- Sore throat
- Uncontrollable cough that causes difficulty breathing (for students with chronic allergic or asthmatic cough, look for a change in cough from baseline)
- Diarrhea, vomiting, or abdominal pain
- New onset of severe headache, especially if it accompanies the fever

If symptoms exhibit during the school day, they will be isolated until a parent or guardian can pick them up. If testing positive for COVID-19, that student/staff member should stay home for at least 10 days, and have no fever for 3 days without the use of fever reducing medications.

Quarantine - been in close contact w/ positive for COVID-19, stay home for 14 days from last exposure. Notify the health department immediately of positive cases. Any student who has traveled out of state, identified by the Governor as a high risk state on the COVID-19 travel advisory list, will be required to participate in educational and extra-curricular activities remotely until the 14 days recommended quarantine has expired.

Cleaning and Sanitizing: The district is committed to performing frequent and routine deep cleaning procedures. The staff will sanitize common, high touch surfaces in every building throughout the day. The use of community-used classroom objects (ie. school supplies) will be minimized and sanitized regularly after use. For students who travel between classrooms, they will be asked to use approved wipes to clean surfaces of high touched areas of their personal space.

Washing/Sanitizing Hands: All staff and students should frequently wash hands and/or use hand sanitizer stations, which are available throughout the buildings. Hand washing and hand sanitizing will happen at regular intervals daily.

Physical Distancing: Staggered start and end times have been established for the K-12 school day. Social distancing of 6 feet is recommended. When possible, students will travel hallways in one direction. Classroom and learning environments throughout each building are all arranged to accommodate physical distancing for students and teachers. The school has purchased new filters for the air flow system.

Meals

Campbell Elementary & Middle School: Both breakfast and lunch will be held in the classroom. While students eat breakfast, they will be asked what selection they want for lunch and it will be delivered to the classroom during their designated lunch period. No a' la carte items will be sold. All students receive free breakfast and lunch.

Campbell Memorial High School: Breakfast will be held in the classroom. Lunch will be served in the cafeteria where seats will be assigned to students. Students will be arranged six feet apart and will practice social distancing in the lunch line. An additional lunch period has been added to reduce the number of students in the cafeteria. All students receive free breakfast and lunch.

Northeast Ohio Impact Academy: Breakfast will be held in the classroom. Lunch will be served in the designated cafeteria area where seats will be assigned to students. Students will be arranged six feet apart and will practice social distancing in the lunch line. An additional lunch period has been added to reduce the number of students in the cafeteria. All students receive free breakfast and lunch.

Transportation

The Campbell City Schools Transportation Dept. is and will remain compliant to all Health Department and State of Ohio rules and regulations. Cooperation from all students, parents, and guardians will be extremely

necessary to ensure the safety of every student, driver, and aide. The Campbell City Schools Transportation Dept. will continue to adapt and comply with every and any changes that are implemented by the State of Ohio and the Health Department.

Students will be assigned seats as they enter the bus. The bus will be filled from the back to the front as students enter and Educational Assistants will help drivers establish this practice in the first part of the year. The seat the student sits in will be their permanent seat for the year. Students must wear face masks the entire time riding on the bus. Students will sit one per seat by the window, with the only exception being students who live in the same household. Multiple students may wait at one stop and must wear a mask.

Car Arrival/Dismissal

Car arrival and dismissal will occur as it has in the past. The only difference is that students will be spaced upon entering and exiting the building. Staff will be present during these transitions in the halls and other locations to ensure social distancing.

Face Coverings: Face coverings will be required for all students in grades K-12. The District anticipates receiving two disposable face coverings per student from FEMA which have not yet been received. Students, therefore, are required to provide their own face covering and must maintain cleanliness of the covering as they would any article of clothing.

Water Fountains: Water fountains will be shut down during the school day. Students will be provided with a water bottle and will be permitted to fill it in the classroom. If a classroom does not have a sink, tap water will be provided in containers and replenished each day.

Lockers/Cubbies: Students will be assigned lockers and cubbies. This assignment of lockers and cubbies will be on an alternating basis (every other one). Students will not be allowed to congregate at lockers and cubbies during transitions.

Extracurricular: After-school activities follow the same guidelines. Sports activities follow guidance issued by the OHSAA and any state or local health department orders. Spectators will be limited if permitted.

Specials (Encore Classes)

Campbell Elementary & Middle School (K-6): Students will still have specials; however, special teachers will travel to classrooms instead of students traveling to a different classroom. Students in grades K-3 will only have one special each nine weeks, similar to the way these classes have been offered in grades 4-6. Specials offered are Art, Technology, Music, and Physical Education.

The only students who will transition for specials are fifth and sixth graders for band with the possibility of physical education. Band students will be escorted to the room and protective materials for the instruments are being purchased to ensure safety. These students will follow an A/B schedule based on their instrument. Those not performing that day will have a physical activity period opposite their band performance day.

Campbell Memorial High School (7th/8th grade): Consideration has been given to limit occupancy to ensure social distancing guidelines have been met.

Northeast Ohio Impact Academy (7th/8th/9th grade): Consideration has been given to limit occupancy to ensure social distancing guidelines have been met.

Bathrooms

Campbell Elementary & Middle School: The building has multiple bathrooms. Students will use designated bathrooms based on grade level. First and second grade will share a set of bathrooms, third and fourth grade will share a set, and fifth and sixth grade will share another set. Kindergarten students will use the bathrooms in their classrooms.

Temperature Checks

The Campbell City School District has purchased walk-through thermal scanners that will check students and staff temperatures as they enter the building. Any person with a temperature of 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit or higher will be directed to the nurse's office and sent home.

Visitors

No visitors will be allowed in the building unless invited by a school official. Parents dropping off items will be asked to place items in a container outside the school and the items will be transported to students. No outside products are to be brought to celebrate birthdays and parents may not drop off lunches unless they are necessary for medical reasons.

Substitute Teachers

Campbell City Schools has hired permanent substitutes and they will work in the building daily.

Supply Lists: Although students may be learning remotely or face-to-face, supplies will be needed in either educational environment. Most information will be provided once school begins. As an idea for [Campbell Elementary & Middle School](#) the link is a suggestion.

School Uniforms: Students are still required to wear school uniforms per Board Policy. Masks worn that bear statements, slogans, images, or insignias that are indecent, obscene, profane, lewd, or vulgar shall not be permitted as it has the potential to interfere with the educational process.
